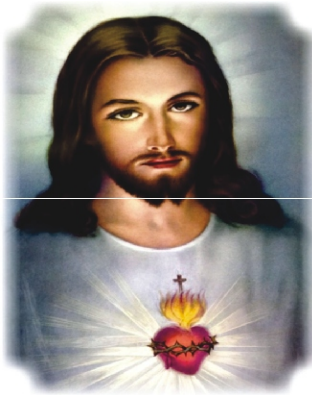

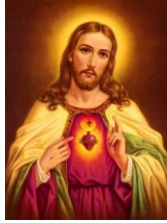

Admissions & Withdrawals

1. The Principal reserves all rights to admission without furnishing reasons.
2. Students are generally admitted at the beginning of the academic term. Admission to classes I to IX will be considered only after the Annual Examination, based on the availability of seats Hence, no prior registration will be done.
3. For admission, Students should be introduced by their parents or proper guardians who shall remain responsible for their fees, regular attendance and good conduct, Candidates will have to appear for the admission test and interview. They must come with: -
 - (a) School Leaving Certificate (if they come from a recognized schools) School leaving certificate of a student joining from outside TamilNadu or within the city must be counter-signed by the Education Officer of the State/District in which the previous school is situated.
 - (b) A certified copy of the marks obtained in the last examination.
4. Before withdrawing a student from the school a month's notice is to be given else in lieu of the notice a month's fee will be charged.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

1. When a student is on leave without prior permission his/her parent is required to come and submit a leave letter on the same day.
2. Once in school, a student is not permitted to leave without a previously sanctioned application letter.
3. If a student falls sick, his/her leave application should be sent within 2 days. If he/she continues to be sick, a medical certificate needs to be produced. When the student rejoins 'Medical Fitness Certificate' from the same doctor must be submitted.
4. Half-a-day leave is not permitted during working day.

DISCIPLINE

Discipline in school life is very important for students. We cannot be well educated without discipline. The purpose of discipline is to develop the attitude, habits, ideas and code of conduct through the social life of the school with the co-operation of the parents and teachers. Discipline in school is the first step in creating a learning environment which will also help the students in their future life.

The School insists strict punctuality, regular school attendance, cleanliness in dress, general grooming and fidelity to study and sincerity to work assigned.

RULES OF CONDUCT

1. Every student must carry with him/her the school diary daily.
2. Students must come to school in neat and clean uniform only. This rule applies even when they come to school for any purpose other than attending classes even after school hours. Scribbling on uniform or its improper wear is punishable.
3. It is compulsory to wear the school ID card every day.
4. **Entry without ID card for student will not be permitted.**
5. All the students must be at their seats before a teacher enters the class.

When changing from one class to another, the students must move in silence and in a line.

6. All the students should greet their teachers whenever they meet them. No student should use abusive / foul language against any teacher and with others.
7. It is not advisable to bring to school valuable articles like expensive or smart watches, cameras, mobile phones, electronic gadgets and jewellery. If found, such objects will be confiscated by the school authorities. The school is not responsible for any lost article. Lending or borrowing of money or valuable articles is strictly prohibited.
8. Students who come to the school in the care of any escort should never leave the school before he/she arrives. If they are delayed they should report to the school office.
9. After the school hours students are expected to go home. They are not allowed to go to their friends' houses, for parties etc. from the school.
10. During recess, no student is to remain in the class room.
11. (a) The school reserves the right to dismiss the students whose parents show little interest in the progress of their wards or whose conduct is harmful to other students/parents/staff of the school.

(b) Immorality or any objectionable activity inside or outside school premises either during or beyond school hours, dishonesty, rude or disorderly behaviour either inside or outside the school premises, or wilful damage to school property is always sufficient ground for immediate dismissal of a student.
12. No collection for any purpose whatsoever may be undertaken without the prior permission of the principal.

- 13.No student is permitted to be a member of any club/association without the prior permission of the Principal.
- 14.If there is any infectious disease in the home/family, parents are expected to report the matter to the class teacher at once and not send their ward o school till the infection is controlled, else school authorities will take serious note and the student will be sent home.
- 15.Sufficient care is taken for the security of the students, However, in case of natural, accidental mishap or third-party negligence, the school shall not be held responsible.
- 16.During activities and outings, the school takes all necessary care and precaution. In spite of this, if any accident or mishap occurs, the school will not be held responsible for the same.
- 17.Students and parents should not offer any gifts to teachers except with the prior permission of the Principal.
- 18.Wearing of nose pins / two or three sets of earrings/ special rings of any sorts, bangles/kada (for boys/girls) is not allowed. Long hair should be nearly plaited while short hair can be tied up as pony tails. Colouring hair& tattoos are not permitted.
- 19.Boy's hair should be short neat and formal. Long side burns are not allowed. Hair at the back of the neck should be clearly above the collar.
- 20.Care must be taken of all school property and no student should scratch or spoil the desks or chairs or damage things belonging to others. Damage even by accident, should be reported at once to the appropriate authority. Any

damage done will be made good by the one who does it. Anyone who sees something damaged should report the matter even if she/he does not know who has done it. Each class will be responsible for looking after all class property.

21. All waste materials should be put in the dustbins provided for the purpose.

22. Throwing stones or playing with hard balls is forbidden.

23. Bringing crackers/bursting or extending any kind of support for bursting crackers or splashing water or colour in the school premises or outside in the vicinity of the school is strictly prohibited, even during festival time. Non-compliance to these instructions can result in expulsion from the school.

24. No student is allowed to self-drive/ride to school motorcycle/ scooter/ car etc...

In case a student violates this rule, the school authorities will be forced to suspend him/her. The vehicle will be confiscated and will be informed to the TRAFFIC POLICE DEPARTMENT and handed-over only after completing his/her studies from the school. (Students coming to the school by bicycles should refrain from pillion.)

25. Punctuality at all times is essential. Students are expected to reach school on time. Regular late comers without valid reason will be punished as per rule.

26. Every student should strive to keep up the high standard of the school by excelling in studies, co-curricular activities, good conduct and maintaining a high moral character.

27. A student who fails in the same class twice shall not be permitted to continue his/her studies in the school.

28. A student who uses unfair means during examination will be awarded a 'zero' in the subject. Repetition of the same will result in his/her expulsion from the school.
29. Progress card will be given only at the Parent Teacher Meeting. Absence in PTM (when compulsory) is discouraged.
30. Remarks, whenever given in the diary should be counter signed by the parent/ guardian only.
31. All the students must converse in English in the school premises. Conversing in English at home is appreciable.
32. During all the PTM's students should come with their parents and in complete school uniform.
33. No parent is allowed to meet any teacher during the school hours unless they are called by teachers. The parents can send their request through school diary.

SUGGESTIONS TO PARENTS

In order to secure all that is best in the education of a child, maximum co-operation between the parents and the school authorities is necessary. We earnestly recommend parents or guardians look into their ward's school diary every day and see to it that the lessons and homework assigned for the next day is done. (The child should be encouraged to cultivate neatness. Remarks given in the diary should be seen and counter signed regularly). If you feel that your child does not make the desired progress the Principal/ Headmistress should be contacted. Private tuitions

are discouraged. No teacher is allowed to impart private tuition. A teacher violating the rule is liable to face action according to service norms.

Parents/Guardians or others are not allowed to contact/meet the students or meet the teachers during class hours.

Criticism of a child's teacher and the school in his/her presence should be strictly avoided. It causes the child to lose respect for the teacher, with the consequent failure to learn from him/her. If you have a legitimate complaint you may see the Principal.

As your child grows in age, guide him/her to become a useful member of home and country. Encourage self-help for work and study. Children should be taught to keep their room tidy., make their bed, polish their shoes, carry their bags etc. The formation of such habits early in life inculcates in them the idea of the dignity of work, a fundamental personal virtue, necessary for a successful career.

NORMS FOR PROMOTION

1. Promotion is granted on the basis of the whole year's work and hence we lay stress on regularity in work and performance in the examination.
2. For promotion, 80% of attendance is compulsory for every student. In case of serious illness or accident the parents/guardians are requested to inform the school authorities in time.
3. The principal with her discretion power can bring the required attendance down to 75%

PATTERN OF EDUCATION

Montessori

The academic year is divided into three terms. There are no formal examinations for the classes. Evaluation of the child's progress will be done on the basis of continuous theme-based assessments, which include creative work, recitation, storytelling, etc. Progress reports will be given to the parents during the open house at the end of each term.

Standard I to X

From this academic year 2019-20, the uniform system of assessment and examination directed by the CBSE will be followed for classes I to X in line with the other CBSE affiliated schools, to increase the confidence in the students preparing for class X Board examinations. The CBSE has decided to implement the uniform system of assessment, examination pattern and issue of report cards for classes up to IX, while keeping in view the provisions of Right to Education Act, 2009, the

scheme for classes VI-IX has been designed on the basis of term assessment with gradual increase in the learning assessment as the students' progress. This will equip the students to cover the whole syllabus of the academic year and face the challenge of class X Board examination, and would thus, ensure the 'quality of education'. The detailed components of the scheme are mentioned below for easy understanding and implementation.

Scholastic Area: The assessment structure and examination for classes' upto VIII have been prepared in view of the provisions of RTE-Act 2009, and it comprises of two terms i.e. Term-1 and 2, as explained below:

The Assessment scheme will have an 80-mark component for Annual examination (class IX) / Board examination (class X) in all scholastic subjects along with a 20 mark component of Internal Assessment. Students need to secure 33 percent marks separately in each of these components.

Internal Assessment (20 Marks)

With effect from the 2018 – 19session, the Board has introduced the remodeled structure of assessment which also includes a component of Internal Assessment (IA) of 20 marks. IA comprises Periodic Tests (PT) with weightage of 10 marks, notebook submission of 5 marks and Subject Enrichment Activities of 5 marks. Internal Assessment emphasizes that learning is a continuous process and the acquisition of learning may be assessed through multiple approaches.

I. Periodic Test (PT) for 10 Marks

Periodic Test is a pen and paper assessment which is to be conducted by the subject teacher. The periodic test format must have question items with a balance, such as, very short answer (VSA), short answer (SA) and long answer (LA) to effectively assess the knowledge, understanding, application, skills, analysis, evaluation and synthesis. Depending on the nature of the subject, the subject teacher will have the liberty of incorporating other types of questions. The modalities for PT are as follows:

a) Mode: The periodic test is to be taken in the form of pen and paper test.

b) Schedule: In the entire academic year, three periodic tests in each

Subject will be conducted as follows:

c) Syllabus: The portion of syllabus will be cumulatively covered in the periodic test with reference to the announcement of date of tests by school.

d) Average of Marks: Once the school completes conduction of all the three periodic tests, they are required to convert the weightage of each of the three tests into ten marks each, for identifying best two tests. The best two will be taken into consideration and the average of the two shall be the final marks for PT.

II. Notebooks Submission (5 Marks)

Notebook Submission is a compulsory part of the internal assessment carrying a weightage of five marks from the academic year 2018-18 as an appraisal tool to ensure regular and attentive participation of students in classroom activities. Notebook submission broadly aims at enhancing seriousness of students towards preparing different types of notes on the topics being taught in the classroom as well as assignments. This also addresses the critical aspect of regularity, punctuality, neatness and notebook upkeep.

III. Subject Enrichment Activities (5 Marks)

These are subject specific activities aimed at enrichment, of the understanding and skill development. These activities are to be recorded internally by respective subject teachers.

Languages: Aimed at equipping the learners to develop effective listening and speaking skills, the language teachers may devise their own methods and parameters for assessment of the languages.

Mathematics: Practical work and activities in math may be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT syllabus and text books.

Science: Practical work and activities in Science may be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT Syllabus and Text Books.

Social Science: Map or the project work may be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT Syllabus and Text Book.

Co-Scholastic Activities

(Classes Upto VIII): For the holistic development of the student, co-curricular activities in the following areas must be carried out in schools by the teachers and

will be graded term-wise on a 3-point grading scale (**A=Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair**).

(Class IX and X): Details of Five-point Grading for Co-scholastic Areas

A Outstanding, B Very Good, C Good, D Fair, E Average

The aspect of regularity, sincere participation, output and teamwork are the basic criteria for grading in the following co-scholastic activities:

- (a) Work Education - Work Education refers to skill-based activities resulting in goods or services useful to the community
- (b) Art Education (Visual & Performing Art)
- (c) Health and Physical Education (Sports/Martial Arts/Yoga/NCC etc.)

Discipline

STRUCTURE OF ASSESSMENT SCHEME

The contents of the Circular no. Acad-05/2017 dated January 31st, 2017 available at CBSE website may carefully be noted for the structure of assessment.

The assessment scheme will have an 80 marks component for Board examination (class X)/Annual examination (class IX) in all scholastic subjects along with a 20 marks component of Internal assessment. Students need to secure 33 percent marks separately in each of these components.

3.1 Board Examination for (class X) Annual examination (class IX) 80 marks

For Class X:

The Board Examination for 80 marks in each subject will cover 100% syllabus on only class-X. The examination paper will be designed for a 3-hour duration. Marks and Grades both will be awarded in each scholastic subject and a 9-point grading system, as followed by the Board in class XII will be applicable. For awarding the grades, the Board will put all the passed students in a rank order and will award the grade as follows.

A-1 Top $\frac{1}{8}^{\text{th}}$ of the passed candidates

A-2 Next $\frac{1}{8}^{\text{th}}$ of the passed candidates

B-1 Next $\frac{1}{8}^{\text{th}}$ of the passed candidates

B-2 Next $\frac{1}{8}^{\text{th}}$ of the passed candidates

C-1 Next $\frac{1}{8}^{\text{th}}$ of the passed candidates

C-2 Next $\frac{1}{8}^{\text{th}}$ of the passed candidates

D-1 Next $\frac{1}{8}^{\text{th}}$ of the passed candidates

D-2 Next $\frac{1}{8}^{\text{th}}$ of the passed candidates

E Failed candidates. No retest will be conducted.

Notes: -

a) Minor variations in proportion of candidates to adjust ties will be made.

b) In case of a tie, all the students getting the same score, will get the same grade. If the number of students at a score point need to be divided into two segments, the small segment will go with the larger.

c) Method of grading will be used in subject where the number of candidates who have passed is more than 500.

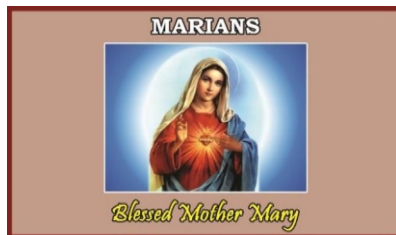
d) In respect of subject where total number of candidates passing a subject is less than 500, the grading would be adopted on the pattern of grading and distribution in other similar subjects.

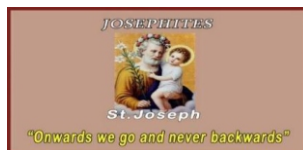

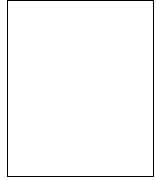
